ACTIVITY #1 INCORPORATING LEARNING INTO EVERYDAY LIFE

We use a variety of skills in our everyday lives. Some of these skills, like addition and subtraction, are things your child is learning in school. This activity will help you think about how you can show your child that the things he or she learns in school will be used in everyday life. In small groups, brainstorm how the following skills play a role in your lives. List some of the ideas on the lines below each skill and then discuss how you can include your child in these activities.

Math: Making sure you have enough money to buy something.

Reading: Reading ingredients or following a recipe.

Writing: Making a grocery list.

Science: Cooking

History: Telling a story about your childhood.

ACTIVITY #2 HOMEWORK CHALLENGES

Brainstorm ways to handle these situations. Try to find a way to get the result you want, such as homework completed as neatly and correctly as possible.

For the fourth day in a row, your child announces "No Homework" as he comes in the door after school. He then asks if he can go play.

Your child begins their homework at the time set aside in your family schedule. Ten minutes later, she says "All done!" and brings you her finished work to check before she goes to play. All the answers are correct but it takes you longer to read the page than it took her to do it because it is so sloppy.

Your child finishes his homework in just a few minutes every night. When you check it, you see that he's made several mistakes. You suspect that the mistakes are because he didn't read the directions carefully.

Your child settles down to begin her homework. After a few minutes, she says, "I don't know how to do this! The teacher didn't teach us this!
