


Who to Know in Education

Your child with a disability will be supported by many individuals throughout their early childhood, education, and transition into adult life. To effectively work in partnership with professionals and educators, one must understand who is responsible for particular areas regarding your child’s development and educational services. You will find however, that disputes and disagreements may occur between you and the education staff regarding appropriate services for your child. To effectively resolve these dispute a clear understanding of who is responsible for decision making and service provision in key areas is a must. There are many individuals responsible in systems at various levels. Key personnel at any level have direct responsibility ranging from service provision to development of the policy that regulates those services. Talking to appropriate personnel at the appropriate level can assist you in seeking clarification and resolving disputes effectively.



This is not an exhaustive list as each system may have additional personnel that support instruction, accessibility, nondiscrimination, and provision of special education services.
